These fellowships are designed to give **all-but-dissertation** graduate students the opportunity to design, teach, and grade their own course relating to Japan or Japanese Language. Each fellowship will be in the amount of \$3,500 (with an additional \$500.00 teaching materials reimbursement).

Awarding of fellowships is contingent on departmental approval of the course. All recipients of this award will need a faculty sponsor to advise them during the progress of the course.

- 1) **Cover page listing your name, department, student ID#, email, home address, and phone number.**
- 2) Cover letter detailing your course proposal, area of specialization, experience (if any), and preference of the quarter in which you would like to teach (although we reserve the right for flexibility in this category).
- 3) Transcript (unofficial University of Chicago transcripts will be accepted).
- 4) One letter of recommendation from your faculty sponsor.
