The Center's China, Japan and Korea committees are making available a **small number** of grants (of up to \$3,000 each) to support pre-dissertation research in East Asia area studies. As the funds are limited, they are intended to enable University of Chicago graduate students to lay the foundations for their research plans - for example, to survey holdings in archives, to identify and meet with scholars or other advisers with whom a student plans to work in Asia. A student can hold this grant **only once** during his/her graduate school career.

To apply for funding, please provide the following:

- a cover sheet with your name, department, student ID#, address, e-mail, phone.
- a statement of how the proposed use of the grant furthers your larger research goals
- the name of your primary faculty advisor
- a project budget
- your academic status
